

JAMES BALDWIN

1924-1987

- Baldwin was one of the most influential authors of the 20th century
- Novels such as Giovanni's room and Another Country deal with racial tensions and queer dynamics in both the US and France

Sylvia Rivera

1951-2002

- Rivera was a queer latina, who fought tirelessly for trans and non binary people's rights
- She was said to have thrown the first brick in the Stonewall riots!
- Alongside Marsha P Johnson, she provided homeless shelters for queer youth

Virginia Woolf

1882-1941

- Bisexual feminist author, Woolf was famed for her affair with writer Vita Sackville
- Woolf's writing was often discourse on social norms, as with her novel, Orlando; an exploration of sexuality and gender

Michael Dillon

1915-1962

- First trans man to undergo phalloplasty (bottom surgery) and testosterone therapy
- Dillon was a British doctor
- When the press found out he was trans, he escaped to India and became a Buddhist monk



AUDRE LORDE

1934 - 1992

- The self-described 'Black, lesbian, mother, warrior, poet'
- Lorde shocked people with her progessive theories on sexism, race and homophobia all stemming from an inability to respect difference

Bayard Rustin

1912-1987

- Rustin was a close friend of MLK Jr and helped to organise the March on Washington
- As an openly gay civil rights activist, Rustin never recieved the credit for the role he played, lest his sexuality was used against the movement

Laverne Cox

1972 - present day

 Laverne Cox is an American actress and advocate for LGBTQ+
