Hello,

With apologies for the length of the letter, I wanted to get in touch one last time this session. It is designed to summarise where we are, outline where we are going and hopefully be a useful reference document for the early weeks of next session. I believe it is all information that you and your young people need to have at this stage. To help, I have divided it into distinct sections and you can hyperlink to any section directly from the list below.

This week and building works over the summer holidays

Any new S2 or S3 pupil who has not collected their new Chromebook should see Mr O'Neill as a matter of urgency. Thursday is the last day of term and classes will end at 12.25pm. I indicated to parents recently that pupils who normally travel on buses can stay at school until the usual bus time if they cannot make other arrangements to get home. I can now advise that the D and E Coaches Nairnside bus will come at 12.30pm but all other buses will not arrive until 3.40pm. So far only two pupils have been confirmed as staying until 3.40pm although I anticipate a few more appearing on the day. Given these numbers, the canteen will operate at breaktime and pupils can purchase food for lunch as I will not be asking the canteen staff to stay on to prepare lunch.

At about 1pm on Thursday, various Council and external staff will arrive to begin moving boxes out of the areas which are being renovated and improved this summer. By the time that pupils return on 15th August, we anticipate having an additional Technical Department workshop, an additional Technical Department computer suite, a renovated ASL Department, another new PE changing room and the redecoration of the current PE changing rooms. This is all in addition to the completion of the 7 additional modular classrooms and the restoration of the upper pitch to a condition that allows meaningful PE teaching to resume there. I believe that this will significantly improve the experience of young people in Culloden Academy come August.

SQA results day and next steps

SQA will release results to all pupils on 9th August. We hope that all our pupils get the grades they want but if your child's result is lower than their estimated grade (handed out last week) you may be entitled to an appeal. The SQA have provided information about how the appeals will work and it is attached to the email that this letter arrived in. We will release a Google Form on 9th August, which you can use to let us know that you would like an appeal. Pupils wishing to change courses in light of their results can ring on the in-service day to make an appointment with their Guidance teacher.

Calendar of events for next session and explanatory notes

Also attached to the email that you received this letter in- or available on the school website- is a copy of the school calendar of events that may be of interest to parents. I would like to take a moment to explain what each of the different type of events means- please retain this as a reference document.

<u>Parents' Evenings.</u> These are the events at which you get to talk to your child's class teacher and there is one per year group. We surveyed Parents as to whether they wanted to retain virtual Parents' Evenings or move back to face-to-face events. No clear decision emerged and so we are going to try to deliver a compromise solution whereby for the next two sessions S1, S3 and S5/6 Parents Evenings will be face-to-face in the building (COVID restrictions permitting)- whereas S2 and S4 Parents Evening will be online. Our intention is to retain the same electronic booking system and by increasing the number of appointments that staff are available for, we hope it will be even more effective.

<u>Parents' Information Evenings.</u> These are presentations which Senior Managers and Guidance staff intend to deliver face to face. Class teachers are not in attendance and we do not discuss individual pupil situations. The aim of them is to explain the structure and the options available to your child so that when you meet the class teacher, you can ask more focused questions or when you are discussing their Choice of Course options with them, you have all available information to hand.

Choice of Course returns deadlines. Please note these carefully- they always occur after you have had a report, a Parents' Evening and a Parents' Information Evening. It is important that pupils meet these deadlines- the process of setting up classes starts almost immediately after the deadline and late returns are more likely to find no space available in classes that a pupil wishes to study.

Rector's Drop-ins. I haven't offered these for a while- for fairly obvious reasons- but will bring them back next session. I will be in my office from 5-7pm on these evenings and with no appointment any parent is welcome to drop in for a chat if they want to get some clarification about our processes, about their child's learning or about some of the jargon surrounding education which is confusing them. If your concern is of a serious nature- please do not wait for one of these but instead follow the school's processes and contact your child's Guidance teacher or Year Head. Sometimes in the past I had no visitors and the most I ever had was 9 so queuing is not likely to be a big issue- it is just a genuine offer to improve communication between home and school.

<u>What isn't included</u>: We haven't added Christmas Dances, Junior Prize Giving or Sports Day yet. We aim to run all these but have not confirmed dates for any of them yet.
